Our Vision

Our vision is to contribute to the regeneration of the local economy, create positive social impact, increase civic pride and develop cultural tourism.

Our activities are delivered by a professional, well-governed and transparent organisation that meets local needs.

History of Open House Festival

The first Open House Festival took place in Belfast in November 1999. It was created by Kieran Gilmore and Alison Gordon, who envisioned a key role for music in the cultural, political and economic renaissance that was about to transform Northern Ireland. It was the first festival in the newly appointed Cathedral Quarter.

Over the next twenty years, Open House gained a reputation for quality events and cutting edge programming by anticipating trends in music, and investing in the cream of



emerging artists such as Mumford and Sons, Seasick Steve, Laura Marling, The Civil Wars and Fleet Foxes.

Open House Bangor initially began with a pilot series of five events in Bangor in 2012. This developed into the first Open House Festival in Bangor, which took place throughout the whole month of August 2013. It was a major success and has resulted in Open House Festival putting our focus entirely on Bangor.

Each year the Festival attracts thousands of people to dozens of events at The Walled Garden and around Bangor. This includes Seaside Revival Vintage Festival, which celebrates Bangor's heyday as a seaside town, and free live music on Sundays throughout the summer at Picnic In The Park. We recently opened our own venue too, The Court House, which sees a yearround programme of events in the heart of Bangor. We will continue to organise one off gigs in Belfast and Bangor too.

The Open House Festival Team

Open House Festival Limited is a charity, run on a not-for-profit basis. Most of our income is from ticket sales, and we receive support from several funders including A&NDBC and the National Lottery Heritage Fund. Any income generated is used to cover running costs and investing in the next programme of events and free events.

It is governed by a Management Board, and headed by its two founding members, Kieran Gilmore (Group Director) and Alison Gordon (Development Director) who are still at the helm. 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Volunteer Roles

Front of House Duties

- Assisting with the smooth running of the event
- · Collecting and selling tickets
- · Handing out wristbands
- Assisting customers who have forgotten their tickets
- · Distributing programmes

Stewarding

- Directing people within venues to seating, bars, toilets, fire exits and First Aid
- Being the friendly face and eyes and ears of the festival
- · Keeping venues attractive, safe and tidy
- Reporting any hazards or problems to staff and security

- Assisting with evacuation in case of emergency
- Answering customer queries about the venue and event
- Keeping customers informed about other upcoming Open House Festival Events

Team Leaders

We sometimes need Volunteer Supervisors and Team Leaders for our larger festival events. These are generally volunteers who are already experienced with Open House Festival. They must be reliable, enthusiastic and able to deal with volunteers, the public and Open House staff in a fair and calm manner. Please speak to the Volunteer Coordinator if you are interested in one of these roles. Roles will be assigned at the discretion of the Volunteer Co-ordinator.

- Understand our values and mission and behave appropriately
- Treat others with respect, consideration and appreciation no matter who they are
- Take part in any training and meetings required for your role
- Be professional and safe when volunteering
- Carry out your designated duties to the best of your abilities
- Comply with the Volunteer Code of Conduct & dress code
- Talk to us if you have a problem, let us know
- Be an ambassador for the Festival and for Bangor
- Have fun!

You can expect us to...

- · Value and respect you
- Make sure you know what your role is and how to do it
- Provide training and support to enable you to carry out your role
- · Ensure you are safe while volunteering
- · Recognise your contribution

How we will support you

We will hold induction meetings and a training day and ask that you attend these so you can feel confident when you come to volunteer for us.

We will have a short meeting prior to the start of each Festival event when the Event Manager will give you a tour of the site or venue, assign you an activity, discuss health and safety at the event and let you know when you can take a break. The Event Manager will answer any queries during the meeting or festival event.

Feel free to contact the Volunteer Coordinator for support, advice and help to resolve any problems.

















Essential Information

Please read the following guidelines carefully. Our policies are listed on the Volunteer page on the Open House Festival website. Once you start volunteering with us, we will ask you to familiarise yourself with our policies.



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Volunteer Policy

Our volunteer policy emphasises the value we attach to volunteering and our relationship with our volunteers. It outlines how and why we involve our volunteers including how we recruit, select and manage them, and our principles of best practice. Code of Behaviour

This sets out how we expect our volunteers to conduct themselves plus details of health and safety points we expect our volunteers to adhere to.

Reliability and Time Keeping

While we don't have a legal contract with you, we do have certain hopes and expectations for our volunteers. We depend on our volunteers so it is really important that we can rely on your support when it is needed. Please try to keep to any arrangements you make. If you can't make a shift let the Volunteer Co-ordinator know as soon as possible. If you miss several slots the Volunteer Co-ordinator may have a chat with you to make sure you are still able to volunteer.

Health and Safety

The Festival takes the health and safety of its volunteers very seriously; it is a key issue in our volunteer training and management. In the training, volunteers are asked to share some of the responsibility for Health and Safety by behaving sensibly and being proactive in helping us implement good health and safety practices. This includes reporting concerns or any possible improvements to a member of staff as soon as possible. If you witness an accident, incident or a near miss while volunteering, please report it immediately to the Event Manager, the Volunteer Co-ordinator or another member of staff as soon as possible.





Diversity

Open House Festival is committed to being a diverse and inclusive organisation. We seek to create a harmonious working environment where the dignity and self-esteem of individuals are important. Any behaviour which may cause offence to a member of staff or volunteer because of their disability, gender, marital status, religious belief, political opinion, age, race, colour or sexual orientation, is not acceptable.

We are committed to providing equal opportunities to our volunteers and protecting them from discrimination.

Confidentiality

While volunteering you may have access to information about Open House Festival or our customers. We expect you not to use or disclose this information during your

volunteering experience or at any time afterwards. We also expect you to maintain confidentiality about any information which is commercially sensitive or not public knowledge, that you may gain access to in the course of your work.

Dress Code

We will provide you with a Festival T-Shirt and a High Visibility Vest. We ask that you wear these at all times while volunteering so you are visible both to staff and to audiences. Many Festival events are outdoor and it is absolutely essential that you wear warm clothing and bring extra layers. Being outside for an entire shift or Festival event, even in the summer, can be cold and sometimes wet. Volunteers must also wear closed toe shoes e.g. no sandals or flip flops.

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Expenses

We are very grateful to the vast majority of volunteers for not only providing their time free, but also choosing to meet incidental expenses themselves. Otherwise, with the number of volunteers involved, we could not afford to deliver the number and variety of events as part of Open House Festival. However, should you wish to claim travel expenses, you are entitled to do so by completing the volunteer expense claim form.

It is important to provide a receipt of payment along with your expenses form to the Volunteer Co-ordinator. If you are driving your own car, you may claim the standard mileage rate for volunteers at 25p per mile.

Boundaries and Media

It's important that all volunteers maintain clear boundaries. This means making sure that what you say and do is within the limits of your role. In your induction the Volunteer Co-ordinator will tell you more about your boundaries relating to your volunteering.

As a volunteer you are representing Open House Festival. We would like you to be involved in promoting Open House Festival, but getting the right message across can be tricky, so if you are approached by the media to make a comment or answer a question, its best to refer them to a member of Open House Festival staff.

Open House Festival also has a Social Media Policy which can help you understand how you as a volunteer should use social media in relation to volunteering with Open House Festival.





Data Protection

We pledge to always keep details about you safe and secure. In your role as a volunteer with Open House Festival you may have access to information about our customers. You must only use this data when necessary and dispose of it securely when you have finished using it. Any customer lists should be handed back to the Event Manager.

Open House Festival in compliance with The General Data Protection Regulations 2018 will treat in confidence the information it holds about volunteers. The information will be held while there is a legitimate business purpose for doing so. Volunteers have the right to request to see all the information held about them by Open House Festival.

Complaints

If you want to make a complaint relating to volunteering, please follow our complaints policy.

IT and Communications Policy

This policy outlines Open House Festival's IT practice and acceptable internet/email use.

Smoking Policy

Smoking is only permitted in specific and designated areas at Open House Festival events. We expect volunteers to respect and abide by this. We ask that volunteers who smoke do so only during breaks, outside, and away from Open House Festival events.

Criminal Convictions

We expect you to let us know about any previous criminal convictions which may affect your suitability for the volunteer role you are applying for. We also expect you to let the Volunteer Co-ordinator know as soon possible if you become subject to any criminal proceedings, charges or convictions. If you don't tell us then we will have to review your volunteering and you might be asked to leave.



Volunteer Duties

Where possible we try to match our volunteers to events that they are interested in. However to ensure the smooth running of the Festival, we will allocate shifts based on your availability and the requirements for each Festival event. We ask that you attend the event and carry out the activity designated to you to the best of your ability. Let us know if there is a reason why you feel you are unable to assist at outdoor events, as this may affect the number of events you can volunteer at.

The Event Manager or Volunteer Co-ordinator will hold a short meeting before each Festival Event when volunteers will be assigned an activity. We would ask that you carry out the task assigned to you and remain at the Festival event until your shift ends. Please let the Event Manager or Volunteer Co-ordinator know if you need to leave early.

Employment

When you volunteer with us your status will be as a volunteer. Neither you nor we intend any employment relationship nor any employment rights or workers' rights to be created either now or at any time in the future as a result of you volunteering with us.

Volunteering is a great way to boost your CV and improve employability. It shows commitment and dedication to prospective employers. If you are unemployed or receiving benefits you should contact your local Job Centre and let them know that you are volunteering. This should not affect your benefits.

It is your responsibility if you are not a UK citizen to ensure that you are legally entitled to volunteer within the UK. It is a criminal offence for you to take on a role illegally. You could also jeopardise any visa entry clearance rights, or permission to remain requirements, if you volunteer in circumstances where you are not permitted to.

Volunteers may request references when seeking employment. References will be given at the discretion of the Festival Director.

Leaving Us

We want our volunteers to have a positive experience from start to finish. If you want to have a break or feel like it is time for you to stop volunteering for us, please speak to the Volunteer Co-ordinator and let them know. You are free to cease volunteering with Open House Festival at any time although wherever possible an agreed period leading up to this point would help us to make any alternative arrangements required.

Insurance

All volunteers are covered by Open House Festivals Employer's Liability insurance while volunteering for Open House Festival. Personal equipment and belongings however, are not covered under this insurance.

Dee & Don Award

In recognition of the amazing work of our volunteers we have set up an annual award for the Volunteer of The Year in honour and memory of Dee Cooke & Don Thompson, who volunteered with Open House Festival. Staff and volunteers are welcome to make nominations for this award.
